This month we visited two of our volunteers to see what they do in their projects. Keep reading to find out!


#### **AURELIE - FRANCE**

# SUPPORTING SOMERFORD YOUTH CENTRE

This month we visited the Someford Youth Centre and spoke to Jae Harris about the work they do there.

There is not much money in this area so we help the community by providing different **services** and **programmes** such as after school or activities during the holidays. In general we help the community, we help



families with the People's Pantry which is a low-cost service for families who are experiencing food poverty. We also run other services for young people such as mentoring and mental health support and we have rooms at the centre that are available for lettings.
